Agenda items:

- The meeting was called to order by Mike Johnson, SCC Chair, at 3:50 pm. A motion to approve last meeting minutes was made by Sarah Chatterton. The motion was seconded by Tiffany Rowberry and a vote was called for. The motion passed unanimously.
- 2. The question regarding cameras on the student Chromebooks from our prior discussion regarding Digital Citizenship and Safety was brought up. More information was requested to more fully understand the question when answering. Principal King made a motion to postpone this topic until the next meeting when Dan Cramer is here as he was the one who asked the question. Principal King will follow-up in order to present a response to SCC at the next meeting. This motion was seconded by Sarah. The motion was passed with a unanimous vote.
- 3. Principal King provided an update on the 4th grade class sizes and supports being provided to the teachers and students. The discussion centered around grading and standards. It was suggested that we add a parent tip sheet to our Viewmont Website. Afterwards it was discussed that a classroom reduction aide had been hired (then quit after getting a full time job with benefits), another was hired (then quit due to a need to balance between work and college responsibilities), and we are currently looking for a replacement. A reading paraprofessional has been working with 4th graders to support small group instruction. Mrs. King has also purchased 21 Lexia licenses to support students who could benefit from the program. Students will also have incentives for IXL and Imagine Learning. As of today, a math para has been hired to come in three days a week to support 4th grade students.

- 4. Principal King shared the Land Trust Expenditures with the members of the Community Council to date. It is anticipated that technology and human resources will be items we may want to budget for in the future.
- 5. The School's <u>PBIS Plan</u> was presented to the SCC and discussed. Each of MSCDs PBIS plans were presented to the Murray School Board at last week's School Board Meeting.
- 6. A motion was made to adjourn the meeting at 5:03 pm by Mallory Poole and seconded by Sarah Chatterton. The motion passed unanimously.
