Agenda items:

- 1. The meeting was called to order by Sarah Chatterton, SCC Vice-Chair, at 3:45 pm. A motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on 2/13/23 was made by Vangee Watts. The motion was seconded by Tiffany Rowberry. The motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Mrs. Preece, the school social worker, updated the SCC on the **VMT PBIS Plan**.
- 3. The SCC discussed questions and comments on the proposed Land Trust Plan for the 2023-24 plan which was developed and presented at the previous meeting. A motion was made to approve the plan, as written, by Tara Minert. This motion was seconded by April Johnson. The vote was approved by a vote of 9 for the plan and 0 not in favor of the plan, with Mike Johnson and Brittany Hughes absent.
- 4. Principal King presented the <u>2023-24 TSSA plan</u> and its associated expenditures.
 Principal King addressed questions from the members of the SCC about the plan. These questions included:
 - a. What data is available on behavior issues to parents and teachers?
 - b. What is the cost of material expenses if we adopt the second step program materials already purchased by district?

- i. Principal King will check to understand this cost (i.e. additional classroom posters)
- 5. Principal King discussed the upcoming White Ribbon Week which will take place the week of April 3rd. This is another significant piece of our work on Digital Citizenship & Safety. This year's theme is: Brain Power. This is the newest program from the White Ribbon Week program.
 - a. It addresses what happens in our brain when we play video games
 - b. It addresses how screen time impacts our brains
 - c. It discusses connections between media and depression and how technology impacts our attention
 - d. Students will learn how to use media intentionally, how to reframe negative thoughts, and how to choose media content consciously
 - e. And, best of all, how to "plug into" real life and all of its adventures

This program has lessons and activities that happen in the classroom and at home. There will be messaging each day to share with the families what their student(s) are learning and discussion topics to engage in the safe confines of the home environment.

- 6. The members of SCC discussed the format for the next meeting and determined that we would meet via Zoom. The meeting is scheduled for April 10, 2023.
- 7. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Mallory Poole. The motion was seconded by April Johnson. The motion carried unanimously at 5:33 pm.
